Help us keep Nordic Fest the best!

- DOGS & OTHER PETS / Must be leashed. Decorah's Animal Waste Ordinance will be enforced.
- "NO PARKING" RESTRICTIONS / Cars must be parked outside of the Nordic Fest grounds Thursday - Saturday, as well as outside of the entire parade route Saturday. See map on back cover. Strictly enforced.
- OPEN CONTAINERS / Public consumption of alcoholic beverages and open containers are only allowed in designated areas, like the Nordic Fest Beverage Garden, per city ordinance. Strictly enforced.
- SEVERE WEATHER / The community siren will run for at least three minutes if severe weather arises; please take shelter at the closest available building. Consult a member of the NF Board for additional assistance and direction.
- TRANSPORTATION RESTRICTIONS / The use of bicycles, skateboards, scooters, roller skates & roller blades are prohibited on Fest grounds. All golf carts must be licensed as official Nordic Fest vehicles. No other carts are allowed.

Northern Europe's only indigenous people call themselves Sámi. Although reindeer herding historically made up a significant portion of their economy, the Sámi are not just "reindeer people." Of the 80,000 Sámi living across northern Scandinavia today, only 10% make their living from reindeer.

The flag for Sápmi (the Sámi name for their homelands in Norway, Sweden, Finland, and the Kola Peninsula of Russia) was designed by Astrid Båhl of Skibotn, Troms, Norway, and was approved at the 13th Nordic Sámi Convention in 1986. The four colors of the flag were taken from colors used traditionally in Sámi clothing called gákti and reflect the primary colors of nature. The flag's circle stands for the sun and the moon, with the red portion representing the sun and the blue portion the moon.

2024 Nordic Fest Skål Recipient -

Jeni Holtan Grouws



The Nordic Fest Skål Recipient is an individual or individuals who have demonstrated exceptional and continuing support of the Fest.

Since 2009, Jeni Holtan Grouws has contributed to the spirit and sound of Nordic Fest through integral roles serving as a Nordic Dancer Director for 10 years, a Nordic Fest Board Member for 6+ years, and as a musician -- with three different bands -- in the festival's entertainment lineup each year for the last 14 years.

Jeni first experienced Nordic Fest in 1996, with enthusiastic encouragement from her parents to make sure to see the Nordic Dancers -- a group that was noted for being unique compared to other festivals' offerings and traditions. Impressed from the start, Jeni later found herself saying "yes" to becoming a Nordic Dancers Director, following her daughter Ella's successful audition to join the group. Her daughter Lillian also joined, as a member of the Nordic Dancer Orchestra. Jeni notes, "I'm very proud to have been a part of that group. The Nordic Dancers really are special and people so often forget they are just kids, who are busy, but continue to get up there and carry on a tradition that is emblematic of Decorah."

In addition to her Nordic Dancers involvement, Jeni served on the Nordic Fest Board as the Entertainment Chair and the Nordic Dancers Liaison. Through the roles, Jeni coordinated the yearly Nordic Fest entertainment lineup and actively worked to expand the diversity and range of offerings. She shares, "By being on a non-profit board, and by serving at events, you are helping to create special opportunities and an economic advantage for the community...it's easy to let other people do it, but at some point you have to say -- when is it my turn to give back?'

At Nordic Fest, Jeni highly recommends trying the meatballs, available at the food booth sponsored by Decorah High School Cross Country. As for events, she of course recommends taking in the free music and entertainment, and making sure to catch at least one Nordic Dancer performance. Jeni would love to see you in the crowd when she once again joins the entertainment lineup too, with the Avey Grouws Band on Saturday from 4:30PM-6:30PM at Canopy 2!

2024 Nordic Fest Grand Marshal -

Paul Scott



Nordic Fest Grand Marshal is an individual or individuals who have provided outstanding services to the Decorah Community.

A Decorah resident since 1985, Paul Scott has spent nearly four decades expanding Decorah's opportunities to gain news and information, contributing to town beautification projects, and supporting the work of area non-profit organizations.

Paul originally moved to Decorah in 1985 after purchasing KDEC radio, which he continued to own for nearly 10 years and was able to expand to include FM radio. In 2001, Paul's passion for sharing public information, and the insistence of others, led him to create decorahnews.com. While he originally had to explain what a website even was, decorahnews.com grew to see 3 million+ visits each year before Paul sold it to Lon Haenel in 2023.

Outside of his career in media, Paul has been actively involved in causes around the Decorah area, with special attention to opportunities that have directly connected to Decorah's Downtown District. Finding inspiration when traveling, Paul helped start initiatives such as the summer downtown flower basket program (inspired by Red Wing, MN) and the Water Street Park project (inspired by Spring Green, WI). While every project needs to start with an idea, Paul notes that the execution is often a team effort and especially thanks Norm Smith for making the flower basket program a success with creative solutions for watering the flower baskets regularly.

In addition to helping with town beautification projects, Paul has been an active member of the Decorah Rotary Club, serving as the President twice in his tenure of involvement. When it comes to being active in the community, Paul encourages others to "just speak up and volunteer", noting there are always people, projects, and organizations looking for extra hands and energy to assist with efforts.

While attending Nordic Fest, Paul recommends enjoying at least one bratwurst, available at the food booth sponsored by Luther College (previously sponsored by Sunflower Child Development & Discovery Center). Looking for a new experience? Join Paul for his favorite Nordic Fest activity -- the street dance hosted by Foot-Notes (which is offered twice!), honoring the traditions of "the old country".

band hits with a gritty, powerful sound and impressive songwriting. Their performances across the country as well as at the Big Blues Bender last fall alongside blues legends such as Keb' Mo', Shemekia Copeland and Tab Benoit further established them as rising stars in the modern blues/roots rock scene.

CEDAR COUNTY COBRAS

Cedar County Cobras play American Roots & Blues music from the last century. The music takes on an 'old time' blues feel that would most likely be found in a juke-joint down a gravel road in rural Iowa. Arriving



with an upright bass, foot-drum, mandolin, and a collection of guitars, this duo plays music that is best described as "bootstompin" delta blues and roots blues. Fans of the Cobras have described the music as contagious, acoustic rockabilly, dancing bluegrass, or old-time country with the gritty sound of soulful blues.

GOATROPER


THURSDAY 8 - 10:30 PM CANOPY 1
